DRESS CODE FOR TRIP: Pupils can wear their own clothes and are not required to wear school uniform.

We would recommend a jacket / light coat in case of rain.

ESSENTIALS FOR THE TRIP: Packed lunch, a drink and sun cream.

LUNCH REQUIRED: YES (Those eligible for free school meals will be given a packed lunch).

Born as a small family run business by the Jackson family in 1963, the Welsh Mountain Zoo - also known as the National Zoo of Wales, is the oldest and most established Zoo in Wales. Set on one of the most picturesque and unique landscapes for any UK Zoo, the Zoo occupies around 37 acres of lush green land-scape. The site overlooks the Colwyn Bay coastline and the Carneddau mountains in North Wales.

Pupils will get the opportunity to see around 80 species housed at the zoo. Pupils will have the opportunity to explore the zoo in small groups overseen by a member of YBA staff.

TIMINGS OF TRIP: Leave YBA at 9.00am, arriving back in time for the busses at 3.00pm.

TRAVEL TO AND FROM TRIP: BY PRIVATE COACH

DRESS CODE FOR TRIP: Pupils can wear their own clothes and are not required to wear school uniform; we would recommend they wear "older" clothes and bring a pair of shorts/leggings etc. to change into as they can get quite muddy and wet when using the equipment.

ESSENTIALS FOR THE TRIP: Packed lunch and a drink, sun cream, a sense of fun and adventure.

LUNCH REQUIRED: YES (Those eligible for free school meals will be given a packed lunch).

Crocky Trail is a kid's adventure park in Chester. On this trip you son or daughter will have the opportunity to experience as many rides, slides and trails as possible. Pupils will experience Crocky Trail in small groups supervised by YBA staff.

**The Trail:** This is a mile long experience where pupils where pupils can soar through the air on rope swings, test their balance whilst crossing a variety of wobbly bridges over the Crocky stream. Enjoy a break from gravity by taking a spin on our whimsical roundabouts. Race your friends whilst navigating through complex mazes surrounded by twists and turns.

**Slides:** Pupils will test their nerve on a range of vertical slides.

**Rides:** Pupils will have the opportunity to enjoy some of our classic rides like the Spinning Disk, Titanic and the terrifying Flusher.

TIMINGS OF ACTIVITY: NORMAL SCHOOL DAY

TRAVEL TO AND FROM ACTIVITY: WALKING (YBA TO ALYN WATERS AND BACK)

DRESS CODE FOR ACTIVITY: NON-SCHOOL UNIFORM. Students should come dressed for a full day outside, appropriately for the weather, including physical activities and paddling in the river.

ESSENTIALS FOR THE ACTIVITY: Water, suncream, sunhat, packed lunch.

DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY: Have you ever wandered what creatures live in your local community? This is a day of discovering the natural environment by spending the day exploring Alyn Waters. - ✓ Leave the group and go off on their own
- √ Take part in any activity which has not been authorised by their parents or group leader
- ✓ Drop litter or do anything that might damage the environment.

#### When using transport all students will:
