Polo Shirts

All pupils are required to wear a white polo shirt.
The shirt should either be plain white, or embroidered with the school name. No other logos are allowed.



Plain white polo shirts are available from all major supermarkets, and other retailers such as Matalan, Debenhams and Marks and Spencer.

Bryn Alyn polo shirts can be purchased from RAM Leisure.



Sweatshirts

A black, crew necked sweatshirt is required.
The sweatshirt should either be plain black, or embroidered with the school name.
No other logos are allowed.



Plain black sweatshirts are available from all major supermarkets, and other retailers such as Matalan, Debenhams and Marks and Spencer.

Bryn Alyn sweatshirts can be purchased from RAM Leisure.

Woollen jumpers, v-necks, hoodies, jackets and cardigans are not allowed.



Trousers / Skirts

Trousers should be black and school appropriate, and skirts should be black and reaching the knee.

Trainers, canvas pumps, high heels and Vans are not acceptable in school:

PE Kit

All pupils are required to wear a red polo shirt. The shirt should either be plain red, or embroidered with the school name. No other logos are allowed.



Shorts should be plain black, no logos allowed:



Pupils are also required to wear appropriate training shoes.

The following items are also required for PE:

Red sweatshirt — either plain or embroidered with the school name (optional)

White training socks (NOT trainer socks)

Black football/hockey socks (NOT trainer socks)

Football boots

Swimwear (plain, dark one piece)

Plain red polo shirts and black shorts are available from all major supermarkets, and other retailers such as Matalan, Debenhams and Marks and Spencer.

Red Bryn Alyn polo shirts and sweatshirts can be purchased from RAM Leisure.

Plain black shorts can also be purchased from RAM.

In addition to the above items, we strongly recommend that pupils wear appropriate protective clothing/items when engaging in contact sports during PE and games of a competitive nature, including shin-pads for football.

If your child is not participating in PE (for a medical reason and you have provided a note), please ensure that they still bring their full PE kit as they still get changed.

Additional Information

- Pupils are required to carry a bag which is suitable to carry A4 sized books/folders, a pencil case with pens/pencils, and the personal organiser.

Pupils may also find it helpful to bring a calculator, Welsh/French pocket dictionaries, coloured pencils, writing journal/note pad, geometry set for maths (these items are optional).

- The only items of jewellery which are acceptable in school are:
 - Stud earrings (maximum of two pairs). Hoops and spacers are not permitted
 - One plain, flat ring
 - Wristwatch

Any jewellery worn in school must be removed for P.E. Lessons. It is not acceptable to cover items of jewellery with plasters.

Signet rings, nose studs, multiple earrings or any other form of body piercings such as lip or tongue piercings are unacceptable within school.

- Hair—There should be no extremes in colour or style. Long hair should be tied back for PE, technology and other practical activities.
