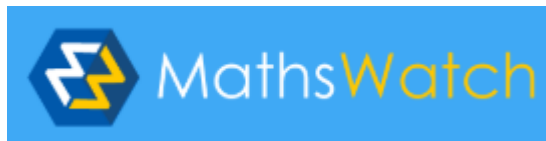


# MATHS WORK DURING THE SCHOOL CLOSURE.



Please note the majority of maths lessons will be set on the computer programme Maths Watch.

Pupils will be set tasks that follow their learning plans and all content will be covered for the duration the school is closed. The time the tasks take will cover both the maths lesson and homework. Pupils will be set lessons as per their timetable.

Each assignment will have a set of questions and a video tutorial. It is very important pupils watch the video tutorial before they try to answer the questions. It may be necessary to watch the video several times.

Some of the questions can be answered mentally. For many questions pupils will need paper so they can work out the answer with a written method.

The programme provides mathematical equipment and an online calculator. Note the calculator will not be available for some questions so pupils should try to answer the questions without using one. Guidance on how to use the equipment can be found in the 'Extras' tab at the top of the screen.

**All work is marked by the programme. Pupils Do NOT need to download or copy the work to send to their teacher. Teachers will be monitoring work completed and give required feedback.**

**Pupils will also be expected to be regularly using TT Rockstars and Eedi Diagnostic Questions which maths teachers will be monitoring too.**

Pupil logins have been sent to pupils via google classroom. If a pupil has a problem can they please contact their maths teacher via google classroom.

I recommend pupils continue to complete the 5 A Day questions on Corbett Maths.

Finally, pupils will need maths equipment which includes compass, protractor and a calculator. For transformation questions, grease proof paper is a good substitute for tracing paper.
