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## Yr Effaith a'r Canlyniadau/ Impact and Outcomes

Increase in opportunities for both KS3 and KS4 pupils to access Expressive Arts Curriculum. Dance and Drama now taught at KS3. Extension to enrichment activites: Yr 7 Drama Club, School Choir, School Production planned for Summer 2020. YBA has been accepted onto the ERAMUS Programme.

HLTA: have adpated LSA timetable to allow her to gain the experience of whole class teaching to allow her to apply for the next round of HLTA applications.

Teaching and Learning: variety of CPD sessions have been put on to support teachers in the classroom "The school has introduced a useful

range of relevant initiatives to improve the quality of teaching and learning. Estyn March 2019". Impact: teaching and learning has moved from less than 20% satisfactory (Estyn 2017) to more than half showing good characteristics, Estyn July 2019.

50% of teaching staff attended external training linked to teaching and learning or the new curriculum. This has resulted in learning plans being adapted.

Mathematics staff have attended training for Mastery in Mathematics and CPD time is being given over to team planning. Gaps in esstential skills (numeracy) are being identified and filled in Year 7 as a result progress will improve over time.

Transition Project: English staff have a clear idea of what new Year 7 pupils can and can't do. Identifies easily if pupils are not making progress or being sufficiently stretched.

Y Cam Nesaf/Next stage Carry out ICT audit of staff's skills and knowledge.

Organise cross-faculty planning days summer term to look at implementation of the new curriculum at YBA.
